Background:

The Queens Library Foundation (the "Foundation") Board of Directors elect new directors, subject to the approval of the Queens Borough Public Library's Board of Trustees. In particular, pursuant to Article III§1 of the Foundation's bylaws, "The Board of Directors shall consist of Members, as elected by the Board of Directors, and as approved by a majority of the Board of Trustees of the Queens Library."

Current Status:

The Foundation Board of Directors has elected Judith E. Bergtraum, Esq. and Robert D. Santos, Esq. to the Class of 2022. Their election was approved by the Foundation Board of Directors at its meeting held on June 19, 2019.

Their biographies are attached.

Pursuant to the Foundation's bylaws, as described above, the election of Ms. Bergtraum and Mr. Santos is subject to the approval of the Library Board of Trustees.

Judith E. Bergtraum, Esq.

Judith Bergtraum has served as CUNY's Vice Chancellor of Facilities Planning, Construction and Management since 2014. In her current capacity, she oversees a five-year capital construction budget of over \$3 billion and manages CUNY's \$97 million real estate portfolio across the University system's 25 schools throughout the five boroughs. Ms. Bergtraum is responsible for the design, programming, and construction of campus and central office facilities and coordination of the University's state of good repair program. She oversees the capital budget request process, financial management, and procurement operation required for administration of capital projects. She also continuously consults with college presidents, the Board of Trustees, DASNY, and city and state agencies for the advancement of CUNY's capital program.

Previously, she served as First Deputy Commissioner at the New York City Department of Transportation and, before that, as Deputy Commissioner, Performance and Management Accountability. As First Deputy, Ms. Bergtraum managed 4,500 staffers and a \$450 million expense and \$1.5 billion capital budget. During her tenure at DOT she was a juror on the City Lights Competition.

She held three management posts with the city's Department of Citywide Administrative Services: Deputy Commissioner, Division of Municipal Supply Services; First Assistant Commissioner, Division of Municipal Supply Services; and Assistant Commissioner, Strategic Planning. In the Mayor's Office of Operations, she was Assistant Director, Project Management and Productivity; and Assistant Director, Citywide Services.

Ms. Bergtraum was also deeply involved with the city's public education system, starting as an elementary and special education teacher, before moving into administrative posts in special education with the former Board of Education. She was also an elected member of Community School Board 25 in Queens and president of Community Education Council District 25. She has served on the Mayor's Panel for Education Policy. She is a member of the Society for College and University Planning, as well as the Queens Borough Public Library board. She is also a member of the Board of the University Prep Charter High School in the Bronx.

Ms. Bergtraum has a bachelor's degree from the State University of New York, a master's in special education from Boston University, and a JD degree from Brooklyn Law School.

Robert D. Santos, Esq.

Robert Santos is the former Vice President for Campus Planning and Facilities Management at City College of New York, overseeing all phases of facilities planning and capital projects on the CCNY campus and having managerial responsibility for Physical Plant Services and Environmental Health and Safety.

Mr. Santos has had a long, wide-ranging career in higher education, cultural institutions, municipal government and construction. He was the Vice President and Chief Operations Officer of The New York Public Library and also worked as Chief Administrative Officer at Adelphi University in Garden City, NY. Prior to that, Mr. Santos was an Assistant Vice President with Lehrer McGovern Bovis, Inc., where he served as a project executive on assignments worth almost a quarter billion dollars for several New York City municipal agencies. Mr. Santos has held several positions in New York City government, including service as an Assistant Commissioner of the Department of Housing Preservation and Development, Executive Director of the Flushing Meadows – Corona Park Development Corporation, and Deputy Commissioner for Operations at the Department of Parks and Recreation.

Mr. Santos is also a highly decorated veteran of the Vietnam War, serving as a platoon leader with the 101st Airborne in South Vietnam and earning numerous medals, including a Purple Heart, two Silver Stars, two Bronze Stars for valor, and an Army Commendation Medal with "V" device. Mr. Santos is very active in the veteran community and his personal experiences have been incorporated into a number of books, including *Everything We Had* by Al Santoli. As the co-chairman for the Memorial Committee of the New York Vietnam Veterans Memorial Commission, Mr. Santos managed the site selection process, the design competition and the construction of the New York Vietnam Veterans Memorial at 55 Water Street, organized and directed a team of editors in the production of the anthology *Dear America: Letters Home from Vietnam* (published May 1985), and negotiated the contract rights with HBO for a documentary based on the book (released in 1988). He established a public trust to maintain a public memorial in perpetuity with the Municipal Art Society of New York with revenues generated by the sale of the book and the film. Mr. Santos currently sits on the Board of Directors of the Friends of the Vietnam Veterans Plaza.

Mr. Santos serves on several boards, including those of the Queens Borough Public Library, the Build NYC Resource Corporation, and the New York City Industrial Development Agency.

A resident of Sunnyside Gardens, Queens, Mr. Santos holds a B.A. from SUNY Old Westbury and a J.D. from University of Michigan Law School.

Revenues include interest income on all Foundation cash balances.

The operating budget approved by the Foundation Board of Directors must also be approved by the Library Board of Trustees, in accordance with the Foundation bylaws.

Current Status:

All individual contributions, foundation and corporate grants, endowments and revenue generated by fundraising events will be recorded by the Foundation. Government grant revenue will be recorded by the Library.

The attached document provides a detailed review of the FY2020 QLF General Fund Budget. Estimated revenues total \$1,762,743. Proposed appropriations equal \$1,762,743.
